Family Diversity Projects

Family Diversity Projects is a non-profit organization devoted to educating the public about issues related to the diversity of family life. Family Diversity Projects creates photo-text exhibits and books in order to help eliminate prejudice, stereotyping, name-calling, and harassment of people who are discriminated against due to race, national origin, religion, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, size, and mental or physical ability.

Family Diversity Projects currently distributes six photo-text exhibits: **Love Makes A Family:** *Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender People and Their Families*; **In Our Family:** *Portraits of All Kinds of Families*; **Of Many Colors:** *Portraits of Multiracial Families*; **Nothing to Hide:** *Mental Illness in the Family*; **Road to Freedom:** *Portraits of People with Disabilities*; and **Pioneering Voices:** *Portraits of Transgender People*.

Founded by two of the artists who created these exhibits —photographer, Gigi Kaeser and interviewer/editor, Peggy Gillespie—Family Diversity Projects also provides speakers and workshop leaders for conferences and exhibit venues.



What Is Love Makes A Family?

“A family is a bunch of people, or not so many, who love each other,” explains seven-year-old Liza Styles, who has two moms. Liza’s family is one among twenty families in **Love Makes A Family**, a touring photo-text exhibit created by the award-winning Family Diversity Projects. With interviews by Peggy Gillespie and photos by Gigi Kaeser, this exhibit features diverse families with gay, lesbian, bisexual, or transgender adults, dads or moms, grandparents, and teens. Together, the words and images in **Love Makes A Family** make visible, in a positive way, the love and caring in these families. This exhibit contributes to the process of dismantling the destructive power of prejudice and intolerance, thus making the world a safer place for all people.
