THE ROAD TO FREEDOM travels to schools (K-12), colleges, public libraries, workplaces, places of worship, conferences, museums, and communities nationwide. The exhibit is championed by diversity and health professionals, families, educators, parents, and all people interested in educating the public about the full range of disabilities and the disabilities rights movement.

Family Diversity Projects has created five different exhibits focused on issues of diversity. The mission of FDP is to propel forward a world where all people and their families are recognized, valued and fully supported, and when "normal" or "different" are words not used to describe people and their family members.

THE ROAD TO FREEDOM teaches:

- That people with disabilities are everyday people live full lives and are not defined by their disabilities
- That people with disabilities often face stereotyping and discrimination
- That all people deserve equal rights and access to a full range of activities, education facilities, and deserve to be treated with dignity and respect
- The importance of actively challenging prejudice and discrimination
